Baptism

3rd Sunday of the month, after Mass. For babies and young children, you must submit a registration form to the parish office (available online and at the parish office) before the 15th day of the month. There is a mandatory Baptism class on the Friday before at 7:00 p.m. in the Okai Room (north door); rehearsal follows in the church at 8:30 p.m. Parents and godparents must be at the rehearsal. Godparents (one male, one female) must be baptised, practicing Catholics. For older children and adults, please contact the parish office.

First Reconciliation, First Communion and Confirmation

For children, the sacraments are received after a set of night classes and a retreat (dates preannounced when determined), These will be some time after Christmas. For adults, please contact the parish office.

Wedding

The couple (not parents) must make the first contact with the parish office six months in advance before setting a date and making any wedding plans or arrangements. A Wedding Preparation Program must be taken at Catholic Family Services (306-525-0521) or through Catholic Engaged Encounter (306-586-0934). Confer with the Pastor to ensure that wedding songs are liturgically appropriate.
